STATIONS *of the* CROSS

Wednesday through Saturday

April 16-19

Enter through Door 13.

Follow Jesus on his journey to the Cross, using stations with meaningful reflections and hands-on activities. (Activities for children, too.)

Wed., 10 a.m. – noon and 5-8 p.m.

Thurs. 10 a.m. – noon only (Maundy Thursday)

Fri. 10 a.m. – noon and 5-8 p.m. (Good Friday)

Sat. 10 a.m. – noon only



MAUNDY THURSDAY

April 17 at 7 p.m.

Maundy Thursday focuses on the Lord's Supper and the new commandment to love one another. This year, we will have an interactive musical service, called *Tenebrae*, by composer Heather Sorenson. It features choir, piano, cello, and narrators. It is a symbolic service of shadows in which we progressively extinguish candles, helping us understand that the joy of the Resurrection is made more powerful and meaningful by observing the darkness that leads up to it.



GOOD FRIDAY

April 18

Good Friday is the day we remember Christ's suffering and death on the Cross. If you haven't yet visited the Stations of the Cross (see above), this is a good day for that meditative experience. Come anytime between 10 a.m. & 12 p.m., or between 5 p.m. & 8 p.m., You could also read through the story of Jesus' passion and death in one of the Gospels: Matthew 26:30–27:66, Mark 14:26–15:47, Luke 22:39–23:56, and John 18:1–19:42.



EASTER

Sunday, April 20 at 10 a.m.

Easter celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the joyous gift of new life offered to all of God's people. We will have joyful singing and instrumental accompaniment with a brass quintet and timpani. If you would like, you are invited to bring flowers to add to our Easter Flower Cross.
